Sunday, October 24th **SHOWING AT 2:00 P.M.** **The Dhamma Brothers** (76 minutes) This compelling documentary follows 36 hardened felons at a maximum-security Alabama penitentiary as they embark on a transformative odyssey by immersing themselves in a grueling, 10-day meditative retreat rooted in Buddhist teachings.

Sunday, November 14th: What Would Jesus Buy? (91 minutes) In this hilarious documentary produced by Morgan Spurlock, the Rev. Billy (Bill Talen) and the Church of Stop Shopping go on a cross-country journey to save citizens from the Shopocalypse and rampant American consumerism with a focus on Christmas shopping.

Sunday, January 16th: GasLand (107 minutes) In his first documentary feature, director Josh Fox journeys across America to examine the negative impacts of natural gas drilling, from poisoned water sources to kitchen sinks that burst into flame to unhealthy animals and people.

Sunday, February 13th: Food, Inc. (94 minutes) Drawing on Eric Schlosser's *Fast Food Nation* and Michael Pollan's *The Omnivore's Dilemma*, director Robert Kenner's Oscar-nominated documentary explores the food industry's detrimental effects on our health and environment.

Sunday, March 13th: Hazel Dickens: It's Hard to Tell the Singer from the Song From the coalfields of West Virginia to the factories of Baltimore, Hazel Dickens has lived the songs she sings. A pioneering woman in Bluegrass and hardcore country music, Hazel has influenced generations of songwriters and musicians.

Sunday, April 10th: Bonhoeffer (90 minutes) This poignant documentary traces the life of German theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer, who was one of the first to speak up against Adolph Hitler throughout Hitler's rise to power.
